KINLOCH NELSON; Friday, November 15th; 8 PM

Kinloch Nelson is a solo guitarist who presents a synthesis of classical, jazz, folk, and popular music. His program ranges from Bach to blues to traditional Celtic to original compositions, and may include musical references to Duke Ellington, Chuck Berry, Woody Guthrie, and even an occasional TV theme song. With 20 year experience as a performer, Kinloch Nelson draws from a repertoire of nearly 300 songs and tunes gathered from his travels through the USA, Canada, South America, Ireland, and Great Britain. The New York Pinewoods Folk Music Club is proud to present him in this Folk Off-Broadway concert. Expect him to enhance this performance with some fine singing and story-telling. 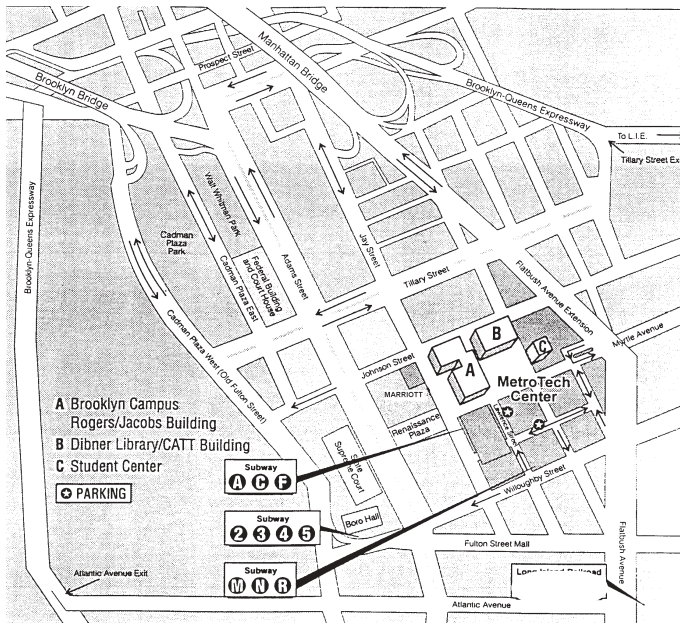
